

Elementary After School Program at Casey Park

This program is offered at Casey Park Elementary School and serves youth in grades K-6 from 3:15-6:15 PM weekdays throughout the school year.

The Explorers Classroom is open to all youth enrolled in Kindergarten and 1st grade at Casey Park and is held until 6:15pm is an after-school environment designed to promote healthy physical and emotional development, encourage curiosity and build social skills. As kids learn to read and write this program seeks to reinforce what kids are already learning in school. By creating a fun afternoon environment kids are supported as they engage in learning activities.

In addition to basic academic needs, Explorers is a place to simply be a kid. Instead of being concerned with outside street temptation and peer pressure, kids are encouraged to respect themselves and others. Kids are taught responsibility, independence, and the importance of just being a kid. Weekly activities include, but are not limited to arts and crafts, monthly bowling trips, roller skating trips, swimming at the YMCA, outside play, and special field trips.

Partnership for Results will offer daily "ProjectBased Learning", which is a "learning by doing" approach to education. The goal is to improve students' social skills, writing skills, leadership skills, and to provide them with a broader knowledge base outside a normal classroom setting.

The Middies Classroom is open to all youth at Casey Park enrolled in 2nd, 3rd, and 4th grades. Middies have a chance to do their homework with assistance. Daily activities include gym time, games, outside play, monthly roller skating trips, monthly bowling trips, and swimming at the YMCA.

The Tweens Classroom is open to all youth at Casey Park enrolled in 5th and 6th grades. The older class children have an opportunity to be themselves. Weekly activities include skating, bowling, swimming, gym activities, writing in journals and many other field trips.
